Infant and Toddler Caregivers For infants and toddlers, school readiness refers to their developing capacity to self-regulate, demonstrate curiosity, communicate effectively, and develop close, secure relationships. Good health and proper nutrition support this developing capacity.

Infants and toddlers develop trust when primary caregivers respond to their unique temperament, needs, and interests (Copple & Bredekamp, 2009). Primary caregiving supports infants' and toddlers' identity and cultural connection to their families (Lally, 1995; Virmani & Mangione, 2013).

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Babies and toddlers need safe spaces for quiet and active play (both inside and outdoors), safe spaces for sleeping, and spaces to interact one-on-one with individual caregivers. Parents and caregivers offer their children love, acceptance, appreciation, encouragement, and guidance. They provide the most intimate context for the nurturing and protection of children as they develop their personalities and identities and also as they mature physically, cognitively, emotionally, and socially.

Parents and caregivers are essential to children's healthy ...

Children and caregivers can remain together in the same room in a mixed-age group in which children who enter as infants gradually become the big kids. Maybe one caregiver moves with a group of children. Even moving a cluster of children to the next age group rather than moving children individually contributes to some continuity of care.

Primary Caregiving and Continuity of Care • ZERO TO THREE

The infant caregiver may move with the infants into the practicing toddler group, or, if the children are comfortable with the new caregiver, she may move back to receive a new group of infants. This same slow process, focusing on each child's adjustment to a new environment, takes place throughout the age groups, including the movement of older toddlers (young

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threes) to the preschool program.

How to Care for Infants and Toddlers in Groups • ZERO TO THREE

The Program for Infant/Toddler Care (PITC) helps you build relationships with infants and toddlers, and develop partnerships with their families, to help them thrive. PITC resources and training are designed to help infant/toddler care teachers develop responsive, relationship-based care, become sensitive to infants' cues, and connect with their family and culture.

A caregiver may smile at infants and toddlers as they arrive in the morning and say, "I am so happy to see you this morning!" Stimulation: The caregiver arranges the environment to provide multiple opportunities for play, learning, engagement, and encouragement of infants and toddlers.

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The basis of infant-toddler curriculum is interaction with caregivers, peers, and objects true Caregiving is not essential to building structures in the brain that have long-lasting effects on cognitive development.

Attachment to parents and primary caregivers is normal. Around eight or nine months, separation anxiety surfaces, and babies object to being away from parents or caregivers. By four months of age, vision improves, and infants pay attention to bright objects, preferring primary colours, particularly red.

As a primary caregiver, you have the chance to commit to the development of respectful and responsive relationships with the infants and toddlers in your care. Caregivers show respect to babies when they treat them as they themselves would like to be treated—as human beings, not as objects (Cheshire, 2007).
