In Software Takes Command, Manovich takes these arguments further, arguing that there is no such thing as "digital media," there is only software that is applied to digital content: For users who only interact with media content through application software, the properties of digital media are defined by the particular software, as opposed to solely being contained in the actual content (i.e. inside digital files).
